Sustainability Report for 1-10-'22 Board Meeting

Community Forest Advisory Committee Policy Committee (CFAC) 12-9-'21

Explanation of proper care of valley oak (aka white oak). Collapse of a leaning tree tree of this species resulted in a death in November. All native oak species will be overwatered when healthy turf grass is grown on their root spread; even riparian trees like sycamores do not need turf watering, so best not to plant trees where there is turf and remove turf in the root area of native trees.

Community Forest Advisory Committee (CFAC) 1-6-'22

Ad hoc subcommittees to explore tree ordinance enforcement and tree equity were formed. Joanne D'Antonio to chair the former and Robin Gilliam the latter. RAP reported that DWP is going through plans to dig up parks and remove trees to install cisterns in SFV despite the fact that open space and trees are natural ways to conserve water. UFD reported that supervisors are being assigned specific geographic areas to better address local issues. UFD reports tree trimming cycles are now at 22 years but would prefer 5 to 7 year cycle. A group in Venice has worked to clear local tree wells of bricks, asphalt, etc. that impedes water getting to tree roots. City Forest Officer reported that a financing study is in progress to address cost of better urban forestry budget to address the needs of city trees.

Board of Public Works 1-7-'22

Chief Forest Officer gave her report and President Good indicted that progress is being made in consideration of trees at the beginning of the Planning Dept. process.

Plancheck NC 1-8-'22

All voting members of Planning and Land Use committees must take training before voting. Training does not expire. If committee members do not take training, whole board will be required to take it. Future Plancheck NC meetings will want to have representation from LA Building and Safety as so many projects do not go through the Planning Dept. and demolitions are taking place that remove character of the community and clear cut all trees, often illegally removing street trees.

Neighborhood Council Sustainability Alliance (NCSA) 1-9-'22

No votes taken. Controversial presentation on Transit Oriented Communities program. Presenter favored the program but many attendees spoke of problems with its implementation and negative results of developers utilizing the opportunity to fast-track getting projects built that did not serve the community. Comments on large number of vacant market rate apartments in Hollywood, disruption of existing affordable housing with gentrification, and cheap unattractive buildings.

Japanese Garden Project Negative Declaration Public Meeting 1-10-'22 No objections to project or problematic issues.
