- 7. Review and discussion regarding California State Assembly bill No. AB 2222 regarding legislation that is intended to clean up the State Density Bonus Act, bill number SB 1818. Los Angeles City Council adopted Resolution in support on April 29, 2014 (Council File No.: 14-0002-SS2 J.Price made motion, 2nd by J.D'Antonio. Motion: The Greater Valley Glen Council supports the Los Angeles City Council Resolution adopted 4/29/14 (Council File No. 14-0002-S52) in support of the proposed State legislation (AB 2222) to Clean Up State Density Bonus Act (SB 1818). Community Impact Statement: The Greater Valley Glen Council recognizes the need for more affordable housing. State law SB 1818 does not protect the number of existing units when a developer is able to receive a density bonus while replacing an apartment building with fewer affordable units than existed. We support the Los Angeles City Council Resolution (Council File No. 14-0002-S52) to support the proposed State legislation (AB 2222) to Clean Up State Density Bonus Act (SB 1818).
